1. Beaumaris

The most technically perfect medieval castle in Britain. It ____ (give) the French name of *Beau Mareys* (Beautiful Marsh).





2. Caernarfon

The most famous and perhaps the most beautiful castle in Wales. The site of this castle _____ (not choose) by accident. It had previously been the location of a Norman motte and bailey castle and before that a Roman fort stood nearby.





3. Chepstow

It boasts the oldest castle doors in Europe. The oldest building is the Norman tower but building work continued well into the 17th-century when medieval battlements _____ (replace) by stronger parapets.





4. Conwy

The most magnificent of Edward I's Welsh fortresses. An estimated $\pounds 15,000$ (spend) building the castle, the largest sum Edward spent in such a short time on any of his Welsh castles between 1277 and 1307.





5. Flint

The first of the castles built during Edward I's campaign to conquer Wales. The king arrived in Flint in July 1277 and by August nearly 3,000 men ____ (employ) in the building yard digging the ditches around the new fortification and the city.





6. Laugharne

It ____ (build) in the 13th century by the de Brian family, probably atop an earlier Norman ringwork castle. Dylan Thomas, Laugharne most famous resident, worked in the castle on its 'Portrait of the artist as a young dog'.





7. Powis

It dates back to 1200 and was once a medieval military stronghold for the Welsh Princes of Powys. Some parts of the castle are said to be haunted. For example, a lady who wears black ____(witness) sitting in a chair near the fireplace in the Dukes Room.





8. Raglan

The finest late medieval fortress-palace in Britain. The present castle _____ (begin) in 1435. A phantom musician reportedly haunts this building, particularly the area where a library once stood.





9. Weobley

One of the few surviving fortified manor houses in Wales. It included fine hall with fireplace, private rooms, sizeable guest chamber and numerous toilets, or 'garderobes', as they ____ (know) back then.





10. White Castle

It is the best preserved of the Three Castles. Its name - first recorded in the 13th century - refers to the white rendering which is still visible on parts of the exterior walls. The heart of this castle ____ (surround) by powerful round towers.
